WHY CHOOSE ENWOOD HOUSE?

Enwood House provides a warm and friendly environment that allows students to concentrate on their daily school routine and extra-curricular activities during the week, without distractions.

They are able to be fully immersed in their academic studies and other activities, before returning home to spend quality time with their family on the weekends.

We offer flexible boarding options to suit your needs. Whether you prefer to stay with us full-time as a 7-day boarder, or Monday-Friday as a weekly boarder, students are well cared for.

Boarding gives students access to a wide range of academic, sporting, cultural, arts, and leadership opportunities that Southland Girls' High School offers. Your child will grow independence as an individual, learn to live alongside others, and develop valuable skills such as resilience and time-management that will stay with them for life.

We pride ourselves on creating a strong sense of community and belonging, both within our boarding community and the wider school community. Students experience a high level of support available at all times, ensuring that they feel comfortable, safe, and confident throughout their time with us. At Enwood House, we provide a safe place for students to learn, enjoy success, and navigate life's challenges. Boarders form lifelong friendships and leave us as a confident young person, ready to take on the world.





YEAR 7-12

A variety of bedrooms are available – from single rooms with an ensuite, shared twin rooms and bunk rooms. All boarders have access to a private space when in a twin share dormitory.

The Director of Boarding allocates the beds each term in an effort to ensure that boarders have fair and equitable access to the various types of accommodation, and to help build connections within the boarding house community.

Parents and caregivers who wish to make a particular request for accommodation due to medical or other reasons, for their child, should make these in writing to the Director of Boarding prior to the beginning of the school term.

YEAR 13

Our Senior students live in modern and comfortable accommodation with good sized bedrooms and lots of storage. A five-bedroom flat and three-bedroom house for Year 13 students offer a special element to the boarding experience. The students learn to live semi-independently, which prepares them for life after graduating from Southland Girls' High School.

A full-time Chef and catering staff work hard to ensure that a range of nutritious and balanced meals are available. All baking is homemade, and the menu changes with the seasons.

We are able to accommodate a range of dietary requirements for students whether they are vegetarian, gluten free or coeliac.

Breakfast

A variety of cereals, toast and spreads, yoghurts and fruit. In the cooler months hot food such as porridge, spaghetti and baked beans are offered.

Lunch

On Mondays students who board receive a hot meal from The Food Hub at school, this ranges from pasta dishes to nachos. The rest of the week students can select and make their own lunch items such as sandwiches with a variety of fillings, fruit, homemade baking, yoghurt and muesli bars.

Afternoon Tea

Crackers and cheese, homemade soup with homemade bread in winter, toasties, scones and baking along with fresh fruit all feature regularly on the menu.

Dinner

A selection of salads and vegetables, pasta and proteins such as beef, fish and chicken, followed by dessert.











OUR STAFF

We have an experienced and caring team of staff led by the Director of Boarding. They get to know each of the boarders well, so they are able to support them in their personal interests and goals. Our common goal is to make sure that all boarders benefit from the safe, secure and positive environment offered at Enwood House.

LOCATION

Students are within walking distance of the school (approximately 7-minute walk) as well as the CBD, swimming pool, rugby grounds, hockey turf and ILT Stadium Southland.



ENWOOD HOUSE VAN

At Enwood we understand that our students have busy schedules and interests beyond the classroom. That's why we offer a courtesy van service from Monday to Thursday, allowing our boarders to attend events after school without having to worry about transportation. The van service is available to all students, and our experienced drivers ensure that they arrive safely and on time to their destination. Whether it's a sports game, a music concert, or a community event, our courtesy van service is just another way we make sure our students have access to a wide range of opportunities and experiences during their time with us.

In addition to this daily routine boarders may be rostered for duties to contribute to the boarding house community.





STUDENT LEADERSHIP ROLES

Boarders in each Year Level are able to apply to be the Year Level representative on the Enwood House Student Committee. This opportunity allows the successful applicants to work alongside the Director of Boarding to organise events, gain feedback and develop leadership skills.

Each year a Head Boarder, Deputy Head Boarder and Enwood Prefects are chosen from Year 13 students to lead the student community and Executive Committee at Enwood House.



SUPERVISED HOMEWORK TIME

Enwood House employs a dedicated staff member to supervise and assist students with their Prep (homework) within a regular scheduled time for each Year Level.

COMMUNICATION WITH PARENTS

All boarders are encouraged to be in regular communication with their parents or caregivers via phone calls, video calling or email. Parents and caregivers are always welcome to visit Enwood either via a prearranged or 'pop-in' visit.



The school's curriculum is learner-centred, future-focussed, and enables students to be actively engaged in knowing and making decisions about their learning.

It is designed to challenge all students, appropriate to their abilities. The school places equal focus on all Year Levels.

HEALTH & WELLBEING



Our staff's top priority is the wellbeing and safety of all our boarders. We understand that transitioning to a boarding school can be daunting, and our team of dedicated staff are always available to provide support and guidance especially during the first few weeks after arrival to Enwood House.

Our House Supervisors are the first point of contact for any boarder who may be unwell or have sustained an injury. All staff hold a current First Aid certificate and are trained in emergency procedures. While we use Vercoe Brown Associates for GP services, we also respect the right of boarders and their families to choose alternative health care providers if they wish.

Boarders at Enwood House are also able to access a confidential service with our registered visiting educational psychologist, Morgan who visits the boarding house twice a week. This service is available to any boarder, and we understand the importance of confidentiality when dealing with sensitive issues.

At Enwood House, we have a zero-tolerance policy when it comes to bullying. It will not be ignored, and we strongly encourage our boarders to speak up if they are experiencing any difficulties. Our staff are always available to provide support and guidance, and we believe that creating an environment where our boarders feel comfortable to speak up is essential in ensuring their wellbeing.
