Southland Girls' High School students are engaged in the learning process and our staff help to nurture each student in their goals.


We are proud of our academic success with the latest NZQA data showing that our students perform year on year above the national average for girls schools.

WE AIM HIGH WHĀIA I TE PANEKIRETANGA

At SGHS we believe in personalised learning for every student that meets their needs, interests and abilities.

Students who show an ability or talent in any subject are encouraged in consultation with parents and teacher to study at a higher level of the school curriculum in this subject. For example, a Year 9 student may choose to study Year 10 English. At SGHS the focus is very much on teaching to the ability of a student rather than their age.

We offer students the following options to extend their learning:

- Subject choices that include extensive Performing Arts classes and Performance PE.
- Multi-Level Learning (MLM) and acceleration mean a students timetable can include different levels of learning eg. a Year 9 student can also be taking a Year 10 subject.
- Ability grouping within a year level for English, Science and Maths.
- Cambridge Exams (IGSCE) Science, Maths, English and Global Perspectives.

WE ARE INNOVATORS HE KAIAUAHA MĀTOU



We are thrilled to announce our exciting partnership with Southern Institute of Technology (SIT) Te Pükenga to offer a Hard Materials Course for Year 10 students in Semester 2 of 2023.

Students will have the opportunity to learn skills in Carpentry, Joinery, Engineering, and Automotive trades. The courses will be held at both Southland Girls' High School and Te Pūkenga. This arrangement ensures that students have access to the appropriate facilities and equipment to enhance their learning experience.

This learning opens up exciting possibilities for students in subsequent years. Year 11 students can explore further opportunities through STAR Courses (Secondary Tertiary Alignment Resource), which provide a chance to gain additional skills and qualifications in specific trade areas. Additionally, Year 12 students may consider joining the Murihiku Tertiary Academy, a programme that offers advanced vocational training and a pathway to tertiary education.














WE ARE CREATIVE HE AUAHA MĀTOU

Southland Girls' High School is renowned for our reputation in the Creative Arts. With a large number of students who participate in the extensive curriculum offered in Music, Dance, Drama and Visual Arts, students are able to study in each of these areas up to Scholarship level.

Dance

The dance curriculum is well supported with highly qualified teachers offering skilled tuition.
Students are able to access multiple performance opportunities and contribute to events such as school productions and ShowQuest. Dance is offered at all year levels and no previous experience is necessary.

Drama

Drama at Southland Girls' High School is delivered by a team of dedicated teachers who are passionate about the subject. Students who study drama develop into confident, articulate and creative individuals who will be an asset to society when they leave SGHS.

The curriculum delivered covers a wide variety of topics and practical exploration of ideas. Students are able to work both as individuals and in groups to produce work that communicates strong ideas and key messages.

Music

Southland Girls' High School has produced a number of talented musicians who have gone on to perform at a high level including the National Stage.

Numerous opportunities exist to showcase their skills – from school concerts, performance showcases, school productions and outside events.

Our three school choirs provide an opportunity for students who have a love of singing and performing to develop their talent.

Itinerant Music teachers visit the school weekly allowing students to learn a variety of instruments.

Visual Arts

Southland Girls' High School runs a successful Visual Arts curriculum that sees many of our students continuing on to study Art at a tertiary level and gaining scholarship awards. With a staff that includes current local artists, classes are offered in Sculpture, Photography, Painting, Printmaking and Design. Students may also study Art History which is complementary to the practical curriculum offered.

Southland Girls' High School is incredibly proud of our school uniform. The iconic red shoes worn by all students ensures we stand out in a crowd.

ENWOOD BOARDING HOUSE KO TE WHARENOHO O ENWOOD

Enwood House provides a homely environment for students who attend Southland Girls' High School.

Catering for up to 100 students in Years 7–13, they live in warm and modern facilities cared for by highly trained staff.

Students are incredibly well looked after and respected as individuals to develop their sense of belonging and self-belief.

An on-site chef ensures the students have nutritious meals, and dietary requirements can be accommodated.

Boarders enjoy the use of a van service which transports them to and from their chosen activities such as sports practices, school events they are involved in or town visits between the hours of 3.30 – 7.30pm, Monday to Thursday each week.

Supervised homework time supports the students in their learning, and all students are encouraged to participate in recreational opportunities.

By living alongside students from various backgrounds, students learn to develop sensitivity towards others while developing an understanding of different personalities.

Enwood House is a short 5-minute walk to Southland Girls' High School and near the CBD of Invercargill, Stadium Southland, Splash Palace and the Invercargill Hockey Turf allowing students access to world-class facilities.

Enwood House provides a safe environment that encourages students to develop their leadership skills and show responsibility for their extended community.
