At SGHS we believe in personalised learning for every student that meets their needs, interests and abilities.

We offer students the following options to extend their learning:

- Multi-Level Learning and acceleration means a student's timetable can include different levels of learning, e.g. a Year 9 student can also be taking a Year 10 subject.
- Cambridge Exams (IGSCE) – Science, Maths, English and Global Perspectives.
- Ability grouping within a year level for English, Science and Maths.
- Students can choose a combination from Science, Maths, English and Global Perspectives.

Cambridge International School

We are an approved Cambridge International School, registered to offer programmes from Cambridge International Education, part of the University of Cambridge.

We are proud to offer Cambridge examinations for Year 9 and 10 students, and be part of the world's largest international classroom.

Southland Girls' High School offers IGCSE (International General Certificate of Secondary Education) to our Year 9 and 10 students.

This internationally recognised Cambridge University Exam is normally sat by Year 11 students, however we believe that by offering it at Year 10 we are better preparing the students to achieve 'excellence' across NCEA Levels 1, 2 and 3.



WE ARE SUPPORTIVE

HE TAUTOKO MĀTOU



At our school, student wellbeing and success are at the heart of everything we do. Our pastoral care system provides a strong network of support, ensuring every student is known, valued, and encouraged to thrive.

In Years 7 and 8, each class has a specialist Homeroom Teacher who supports students' wellbeing, academic progress, and personal development. From Years 9-13, every student is assigned an Academic Tutor (AT) who oversees their wellbeing and academic pathway. Homeroom Teachers and Academic Tutors are the first point of contact for students and families.

Each year level is supported by dedicated Year Level Coordinators (YLCs), who work closely with students, staff, and whānau to provide additional guidance and care.

Our Connexions Centre is a welcoming hub where students can access support from Guidance Counsellors, who help build resilience, wellbeing, and positive relationships. Careers Advisors also work alongside students, helping them explore future pathways, make informed decisions, and develop the confidence and adaptability needed to succeed in a changing world.

Institute of Technology (SIT) to offer a Hard
Materials Course for Year 10 students.**

Students have the opportunity to learn skills in Carpentry, Joinery, Engineering, and Automotive trades. The courses are held at both Southland Girls' High School and at SIT.

This learning opens exciting possibilities for students in

subsequent years. Year 11 students can explore further opportunities through STAR Courses (Secondary Tertiary Alignment Resource), which provide opportunities to gain additional skills and qualifications in specific trade areas. Additionally, Year 12 students may consider joining the Murihiku Tertiary Academy, a programme that offers advanced vocational training and a pathway to tertiary education.



WE ARE CREATIVE

HE AUAHA MĀTOU



Southland Girls' High School is renowned for our Creative Arts. A large number of our students participate in the extensive curriculum offered in Music, Dance, Drama and Visual Arts. Students are able to study in each of these areas up to Scholarship level.

Dance

The dance curriculum is well supported with highly qualified teachers in a purpose-built dance studio. Students are able to access multiple performance opportunities and contribute to events such as school productions and Showquest. Dance is offered at all year levels and no previous experience is necessary.

Drama

Drama at Southland Girls' High School is delivered by a team of dedicated teachers who are passionate about the subject. Students who study drama develop into confident, articulate and creative individuals who will be an asset to society when they leave SGHS.

Music

Southland Girls' High School has produced a number of talented musicians who have gone on to perform at a high level both nationally and locally.

Numerous opportunities exist to showcase their skills – from school concerts, performance showcases, school productions and outside events.

Our three school choirs provide an opportunity for students who have a love of singing and performing to develop their talent.

We have recently opened a new music suite creating a modern, well resourced learning environment.

Visual Arts

Southland Girls' High School runs a successful Visual Arts curriculum that sees many of our students continuing on to study at tertiary level and gaining scholarship awards.

Our talented staff includes current local artists. Classes are offered in Sculpture, Photography, Painting, Printmaking and Design.

FEMME, our premier choir at SGHS, has been awarded a silver award and seven bronze awards at the New Zealand Choral Federation National Big Sing Finales.

SGHS has a large modern gym, extensive playing fields and is in close proximity to an Olympic-sized swimming pool, rugby grounds, hockey turf, and a cycling velodrome. This ensures students have access to excellent facilities to train and play.
